Preamble: This course acquaints students with the constitutional design of state structures and institutions, and their actual working over time. The Indian Constitution accommodates conflicting impulses (of liberty and justice, territorial decentralization and a strong union, for instance) within itself. The course traces the embodiment of some of these conflicts in constitutional provisions, and shows how these have played out in political practice. It further encourages a study of state institutions in their mutual interaction, and in interaction with the larger extra-constitutional environment.

Course objective:

- 1) Students enable to understand the philosophy of Indian constitutions.
- 2) Students enable to know the salient features in making of Indian constitution.
- 3) Complete Knowledge about Indian Government and Politics.
- 4) Make him/her alert and sharp about Indian Politics.
- 5) Preparing him/her for National level Competitive examination.
- 6) Course also acquaints student with influence of caste, religion, region, money & media in politics.

Course Outcome:

- 1) Examining the Fundamental Rights and Duties of Indian citizens with a study of the significance and status of Directive Principles.
- 2) Student explains separation of power in Indian Political System and actual functioning of legislature, executive, judiciary in India.
- 3) Students enable to understand the various acts of Indian Government, their provision and reforms.
- 4) Student simultaneously studies structure & function of Election commission of India.
- 5) Students get knowledge about legislation, executive and law-making process in India.
- 6) Course introduces to student nature, ideology & role of national political parties in India.
