At first they merely strive to follow the fashion of the day; but in the seguel the poison takes effect, the habit becomes fixed, and the sleeping smokers are like corpses lean and haggard as demons. Such are the injuries which it does to life. Moreover the drug maintains an exorbitant price and cannot be obtained except with the pure metal. Smoking opium, in its first stages, impedes business; and when the practice is continued for any considerable length of time, it throws whole families into ruin, dissipates every kind of property, and destroys man himself. There cannot be a greater evil than this. In comparison with arsenic 1 pronounce it tenfold the greater poison. Aman swallows arsenic because he has lost his reputation and is so involved that he cannot extricate himself. Thus driven to desperation, he takes the dose and is destroyed at once. But those who smoke the drug are injured in many different ways.

A) Summarize the following passage.

No elaborate definition of the Essay is necessary for those who read the following selection. The English Essay has a multitude of forms and manners, and scarcely any rules and regulations. A minimum definition would be to say that the Essay is a piece of prose, usually on the short, side, which is not devoted to narrative. The essayist may use anecdotes to make his point; he may even take a leaf out of the novelist's book and create characters to illustrate his own opinions. But his chief interest is not that of the story-teller. The essayist's usual role is that of the social philosopher, the critic, the annotator.

But before we are lured any further in this attempt to identify the special interests of the essayist, let us look over a few of the many types of Essay included in this selection. First, Bacon, the father of the English Essay, who would fail to recognise most of his descendants. Bacon's compact, laconic style suggests the kinship between the word 'essay' and the mineralogist's word 'assay'; for the handful of carefully-washed words which come out in one of Bacon's Essays puts one in mind of the prospector sluicing away the grit until a few clear specks of gold are left in the bottom of his pan. Bacon brooded over some topic of social custom or behaviour until he could reduce his conclusions upon it to almost aphoristic brevity. That is why he so often reads like a string of mottoes and proverbs - except that he has the Elizabethan power of illuminating a bare truth by a brilliant image: when, for example, he likens the ill- natured men 'to the thorn or briar which pricks or scratches because they can do no other'.

The early English Essay made no bones about its deliberate moral purpose. Many of Bacon's are homilies on conduct; and many of the divines who wrote Essays in the seventeenth century were preoccupied with a similar purpose: Jeremy Taylor, for example, one of whose finest testimonies will be found in this selection. A form as handy as the Essay - so short, so free from literary convention - was bound to produce variants of Bacon's or Taylor's manner. Thus, during the seventeenth century there developed a popular literary exercise called the Character - a kind of still-life composite portrait of various familiar 'types' - the Undergraduate, the Poet, the Yeoman, and so on. Few of those character-studies would interest the modern reader, but they are worth referring to here because the)' brought a new interest into- Essay-writing and set the fashion by which such essayists as Addison, Steele and Goldsmith so often introduced into their Essays fictional characters like Sir RogerdeGoverley or Beau Tibbs.

B) Make notes of the following passage.

Globalization involves the movement of people, capital and commodities across national borders. This means that the nation-state borders are made porous in order to facilitate this movement. The movement of people, capital and commodities has a strong cultural component. Globalization can be seen as a mechanism that also results in the merging of cultural practices, the assimilation of the foreign into the native and the encounter between different cultures. Thus, the popularity of Indian food in the UK, McDonald's presence all over the world, the iconic status of global celebrities like David Beckham or 'Brangelina' (Brad Pitt and Angelina Jolie) are instances of the global flow of cultural products and practices. Metropolises across the world have become cosmopolitan, multicultural and hybridized with globalization. Transnational solidarities and political alliances—between anti-globalization groups, ironically—are forged across national borders. Immigrants transform

the nature of cities with their cultural practices and politics. Globalization has also generated a new form of colonial domination, often termed neocolonialism. It does not take the form of violent conquest but is a more diffused, insidious and persistent form that makes as much use of culture as it does of political strategies. Global consumer culture, with the proliferation of the McDonald's golden arch or Levi's jeans, are agents of this neocolonialism when they enter and eventually take over the local markets. In an incisive reading of the new forms of colonialism, Michael Hardt and Antonio Negri have called it 'Empire' (in their book of the same title, 2000). Hardt and Negri argue that for the new age colonialisms, older forms of analyses are not adequate. Empire is a whole new form of rule. It is decentered (has no 'capital' such as London used to be for British India) and deterritorialized (not restricted to specific territories or domains). It erodes the sovereignty of nation-states and incorporates the nation into a global realm. There are no identifiable or recognizable structures of power here because financial, military and political centres are all multi-layered and diffused. It is in this context of globalized cultural regimes, of new forms of domination and exploitation, of multiple displacements and cultural alignments that new approaches to culture and literature and new forms of writing and cultural practices emerge.

- 1) Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) is Government of India's flagship programme for achievement of Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE) in a time bound manner, as mandated by 86th amendment to the Constitution of India making free and compulsory Education to the Children of 6-14 years age group, a Fundamental Right.
