Student Scholarships and Freeships Provided by University

Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar Solapur University, Solapur is a public state university and recognized under $2 \mathrm{~F} \& 12 \mathrm{~B}$ by UGC. The university follows all the respective rules and regulations for offering Government Scholarships to all Students. Apart from this university provides various scholarships, fellowships and incentives to the students on the basic of their performance and merit in academic, cultural, social and sports at national and international level. These details of all scholarships provided by the university are as follows

1) The University is providing fee concession/fee waiver for needy students of all courses. A standard procedure is followed for the same.

- The students who are intending to avail this facility have to submit their application in a prescribed format to the Director of the School. The applications can be collected from the university Library.
- The Director of the School based on the applicant's academic performance and the economic background scrutinize the application and the same is discussed in the school faculty council.
- The recommendation of the school faculty council is forwarded to the Vice Chancellor by the Director of the School.
- The Vice Chancellor presents the same in the Management council meeting and the final approval and rejection of the same happens.
- Usual submission of the application happens in February/March before the academic year.
- Begins in the case of already enrolled students and June/ July for First year students.
- Management council consists of the Vice - Chancellor, Registrar, Director and Head of the Department.

2) The University is also providing Merit Scholarships for the academically excellent students from all the batches and courses. Exam Department will provide the data of the students and the students are awarded the cash prizes from each batch.
3) University also provides the academic scholarships for those students who excel in UGC NET and SET exams as well as other competitive exam.

## Policy to Nurture Academic Excellence-Merit Scholarships

## Introduction

The PAH Solapur University has decided to introduce a reward system for girl students showing a high level of Merit during their academic program at PAH Solapur University. This reward system is in addition to the awards conferred during every year. It is aimed at bringing in an academic rigor among students and keeps them focused on their academic track.

This policy document details the various Scholarships that will be bestowed upon the students during their academic program and the framework to implement and disburse the Scholarship.

There will be three types of rewards for the students:
i. Muli Shikva Samaj Ghadva
ii. Earn and Learn
iii. Departmental Research Fellowship
iv. Sports Scholarship

## i. Muli Shikva Samaj Ghadva:

This consists of the Scholarships that will be given to girl students who are overall semester toppers of their batch and subject toppers in their class. The batch toppers of every class at senior and junior level during an academic year will be given a cash incentive.

## ii. Earn and Learn:

The main objective of the scheme is to develop a student as a multifaceted personality with academic excellence and a commitment to an egalitarian society. India lives in her villages and to bridge the gap between rural Bharat and urban India, this scheme is basically undertaken for the benefit of students coming from the rural areas, who are economically backward, intelligent, and meritorious but cannot afford higher education, needy and financially hard pressed. It inculcates in the student the idea that no work is big or small and develops a work culture with the right aptitude. The list is created every semester for a program. This is a vision of keeping our youth gainfully employed as well as to contribute from civil society. This is a paradigm shift in the way we see higher education. This will make higher education accessible and available to the poor, meritorious and the marginalized.

## iii. Departmental Research Fellowship:

In view of the recent trends, thrust and emerging areas being introduced in research and considering the fact that the major number of University Students having mostly rural background and also due to limited access to the facilities at their disposal, it is observed that the University Students are denied access to facilities of upgrading their academic qualifications. It is also difficult to qualify themselves for the award of various scholarships / fellowships on national and state level which further tends to eliminate them from competition for good academic positions. It has therefore been decided to introduce a scheme to be known as "Departmental Research Fellowship".

## Eligibility:

A candidate having at least $55 \%$ marks at M.A. /M.Sc. / M.Com. Degree of the PAHSUS University is eligible to apply. The upper age limit will be 28 years relax able up to 5 years in the case of reserve categories, women and physical handicapped applicants. The selections will be made purely on the basis of merit.

## General

- To facilitate speedy day-to-day working of the Research scholarship, the following power can be exercised by the Guides of Research student in concurrence with the Head of the Department.
- Sanctioning of leave when it is due.
- Approving of tours of Research Fellows for attending Symposia /Seminars/Conferences in India provided Fellow is presenting paper/papers which have been accepted and for attending workshop/training courses relevant to the research.
- Field work connected with the Research.
- Computation work.
- Consulting rare reference volumes in the nearest University / Research Institution library.
- The fellows may be given maximum 2 clock hours teaching / practical work in a week.


## Operational Features:

- After the end of every month a progress report in the prescribed performs will be sent to the Development Section for payment of scholarship.
- The report of the guide in monthly report should be Satisfactory / Good Progress / Very Good Progress otherwise the monthly scholarship will not be drawn.
- The researcher can avail by 30 days leave with scholarship in a year.
- The tenure of the scholarship will continue from the date of joining the scholarship award and the fellow will work as a full-time researcher during the summer and winter vacations.
- In extreme emergency such as accident severe illness the fellow will be granted 1-month medical leave during the entire tenure of the scholarship.
- Applications for discontinuation of Scholarships will be submitted to the ViceChancellor with the recommendation of the Departmental Research Committee. Any problem in context of application of rules and procedural matters will be referred to the Hon. Vice-Chancellor for final decision.


## iv. Sports Scholarship:

University also provides the scholarship those students selected in National and International level sport festival. University provides the scholarship for sport students in order to encourage and support their talent in sports.

## GUIDELINES FOR THE CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME OF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

## 1. OBJECTIVE: -

To provide financial assistance to meritorious students from low income families to meet a part of their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies.

## 2. SCOPE: -

The scholarships are awarded on the basis of the results of Senior Secondary Examination. 82000 fresh scholarships per annum [41000 for boys and 41000 for girls] are awarded for pursuing graduate / postgraduate studies in colleges and universities and for professional courses, such as Medical, Engineering etc.

## 3. ALLOCATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS: -

The total number of scholarships are divided amongst the State Education Boards based on the State's population in the age group of 18-25 years, after segregating share of CBSE and ICSE on the basis of number of students passing out from various Boards in the country. $50 \%$ of the scholarship is earmarked for girls. The number of scholarships allotted to a State Education Board is distributed amongst pass outs of the Science, Commerce and Humanities streams in the ratio of 3:2:1. In case of shortfall in the number of applications, the scholarship slots could be inter-changed.

## 4. ELIGIBILITY

Students who are above $80^{\text {th }}$ percentile of successful candidates in the relevant stream from the respective Board of Examination in Class XII of $10+2$ pattern or equivalent and pursuing regular courses (not correspondence or distance mode) in Colleges/Institutions recognized by All India Council of Technical Education, UGC Act, 1956, Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India and respective regulatory authorities and not availing benefit of any other scholarship scheme including State run scholarship schemes/Fee waiver and
reimbursement scheme are eligible under the scheme. Students pursuing Diploma courses are not eligible under the scheme.

## 5. RESERVATION

Students belonging to reserved categories/weaker sections /minorities are eligible on the basis of merit, subject to Central Reservation Policy and internal earmarking. Reservations for the various categories are as follows : Scheduled Castes (SCs) $15 \%$, Scheduled Tribes (STs) $7.5 \%$, Other Backward Classes(OBCs) 27 \% and horizontally $5 \%$ for Physically Handicapped / Persons(s) with Disabilities (PwDs) in all the categories.

## 6. ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SCHEME AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

1) National Scholarship Portal (NSP) www.scholarships.gov.in will be opened for online application in the month of June-July every year.
2) Class XII pass out students of the current Academic Year, who are above $80^{\text {th }}$ percentile of the respective State Education Boards (SEBs) are eligible under the scheme and can apply on National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarship.gov.in), before the cut-off date. Physical application would not be accepted.
3) The online applications would be verified at two levels:
(i) By the Institute where the student is studying.
(ii) By the respective State Education Board.
4) Applicant is required to submit requisite documents, such as [ Class $12^{\text {th }}$ mark sheet, Income Certificate] to the Institute.
5) Application which is not verified either by the institute or by the concerned State Education Board or by both will be treated as 'Invalid'.
6) Merit list as per the State allocated quota would be generated from the verified applications.

## 7. RATE OF SCHOLARSHIPS:

The rate of scholarship is Rs.10000/- per annum at Graduation level for first three years of College and University courses and Rs.20000/- per annum at PostGraduation level. Students pursuing professional courses, in case, where the duration of course is five (5) years/Integrated course would get Rs.20000/- per annum in the $4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ year. However, students pursuing technical courses such as B.Tech., B.Engg would get scholarship up to graduation level.

## 8. PARENTAL INCOME CEILING:

The parental/family income ceiling is Rs. 8 lakh per annum for all categories under the scheme and would be applicable from the Academic Session 2018-19. Income certificate would be required for the fresh applicants only.

## 9. DURATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND ITS RENEWAL

A student will be eligible for the scholarship for a total duration not exceeding 5 years. A scholarship under the scheme is renewable on year to year basis up to Post Graduate level in the same stream (except for the students pursuing technical courses leading to degree at graduation level).

If a scholar is unable to appear in the annual examination owing to illness and or on account of any unforeseen event, the award may be renewed for the next academic year on submission of medical certificate and other proof to satisfy the Head of the Institution who will certify that the student would have passed with required percentage of marks or equivalent Grade Point Average, had he/she appeared in the examination.

A scholar would be allowed to continue/renew his/her scholarship if, he/she changes the course of study to a stream not offered by his school Board in Class XII (e.g. Law, Fashion Technology, etc.). Students changing their college/institute of study would be allowed to continue/renew the scholarship provided the course of study and the institution is recognized.
10. For receiving scholarship benefit under Central Sector Scheme of Scholarship for College and University Students, an individual shall furnish proof of possession of Aadhaar or undergo Aadhaar authentication. Till the time Aadhaar is assigned to the individual, following alternative identifiers can be used:-
(i) Aadhaar Enrolment ID slip
(ii) Application made for Aadhaar enrolment
(iii) Voter identity card
(iv) Permanent Account Number
(v) Passport
(vi) Driving License
(vii) Certificate of identity having photo of such member issued by a Gazetted Officer or a Tehsildar on an official letter head; (viii) Identity Card issued by the college or institute or university.
(viii) Any other document with photo specified by the State Government:

Further, the students are required to have the bank accounts opened, especially, in their name for availing the benefits under the scheme. The scholarship will be disbursed directly into the bank accounts of the beneficiaries through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode. The student can track their payment status from the template " Know Your Payment" in the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) portal [ https://pfms.nic.in/Users/LoginDetails/Login.aspx] either by indicating Aadhaar number or bank account number.

## 11. PROCEDURE FOR RENEWAL OF SCHOLARSHIP

For students of Academic Year 2008-09 to 2014-15 (up to $3^{\text {rd }}$ renewal)

Students who have passed Class XII in the Academic Year 2008-09 to 2014-15 (up to $3^{\text {rd }}$ renewal) are required to obtain the renewal application blank form from the respective State Education Boards and submit the same duly certified from their respective institutions which is required to certify:
(a) that the student has secured $60 \%$ or more marks in the previous exam,
(b) that the student has $75 \%$ attendance and
(c) that the student is not involved in any ragging activities.

## For students of Academic Year 2014-15 (4 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ renewal) (Offline)

Students who have passed Class XII and have received fresh/renewal scholarship through the State Education Board concerned, are required to obtain the renewal application blank form from the respective State Education Boards and submit the same duly certified from their respective institutions which is required to certify:
(a) that the student has secured $50 \%$ or more marks in the previous exam
(b) that the student has $75 \%$ attendance and
(c ) that the student is not involved in any ragging activities.

## For students of Academic Year 2015 and onwards through National Scholarship Portal

Students who have passed Class XII and have received fresh/renewal scholarship through the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) must apply online in the National Scholarship Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in) for the renewal scholarships. The $50 \%$ and above criteria will be applicable prospectively i.e. for renewals becoming due from 2018-19 onwards.

Renewal applications sent directly to the Ministry of Human Resource Development shall not be accepted.
