I was born into a middle-class Tamil family in the island town of Rameswaram in the erstwhile Madras state. My father, Jainulabdeen, had neither much formal education nor much wealth; despite these disadvantages, he possessed great innate wisdom and a true generosity of spirit. He had an ideal helpmate in my mother, Ashiamma. I do not recall the exact number of people she fed every day, but I am quite certain that far more outsiders ate with us than all the members of our own family put together. My parents were widely regarded as an ideal couple. My mother's lineage was the most distinguished, one of her forebears having been bestowed the title of 'Bahadur' by the British.

Ruskin calls books "Kings' Treasures" - treasuries filled, not with gold and silver and precious stones, but with riches much more valuable than these - knowledge, noble thoughts and high ideals. The blessings which the reading habit confers on its possessor are many prodded we choose the right kind of books. Reading gives the highest kind of pleasure. Some books we read simply for pleasure and amusement-for example, good novels, ind novels and books of imagination must have their place in everybody's reading, /hen we are tired, or the brain is weary with serious study, it is a healthy recreation to lose ourselves in some absorbing story written by a master hand.

Throughout the world, almost all nations will be celebrating from October 2 this year the birth centenary of Mahatma Gandhi who is now universally recognized as the glorious symbol of truth and nonviolence. Gandhiji was not only a great national leader who liberated India from foreign domination through a peaceful and bloodless struggle, but also a profound thinker who placed before the world certain eternal principles for the guidance of human relationship and international behavior. He laid the greatest stress on the purity of the means for the achievement of noble ends. "The means may be likened to a seed, the end to a tree; and there is just the same inviolable connection between the means and the end as there is between the seed and the tree." The Mahatma never compromised his adherence to this ideal even for the attainment of Swaraj for India. He was convinced beyond any shadow of doubt that this method of righteousness was, "ultimately, the shortest, although it may appear to be long, perhaps too long."

To Gandhiji, civilization, in the real sense of the term, consisted "not in the multiplication, but in the deliberate and voluntary restriction of wants." He always upheld the sublime aim of "simple living and high thinking". While he strained every nerve to provide gainful employment to the hungry millions of India through various constructive activities, he underscored the imperative need for raising the 'standard of life' of the people, including the ethical and moral aspects. To him mere affluence and accumulation of material wealth was 'a primrose path' leading to social, economic and cultural disintegration. "True economics," affirmed Gandhiji. "Never militates

against the highest ethical standard." "An economics that inculcates Mammon worship, and enables the strong to amass wealth at the expense of the weak, is a false and dismal science." At a time when a number of developed countries are faced with this 'tragedy of mere affluence' it would be worth our while recollecting Mahatma Gandhi's insistence on higher values for the establishment of a new world order.

Author, philanthropist, educator, engineer, and public speaker, Sudha Murty has won numerous accolades. She has written over 40 books, including the bestselling Three Thousand Stitches, Dollar Bahu, and Wise and Otherwise. Sudha Murty started her writing career in 1978 with Atlanticadacheyinda, a travelogue in Kannada. Her first English book, Wise and Otherwise, was published in 2002. She continues to write in English and Kannada. Her books have also been translated into several Indian languages making her stories accessible to diverse audiences. Her books are universally loved, with over 6 million copies sold worldwide.

Sudha Murty writes for children and adults in various formats - novels, short-stories, and travelogues. Her stories are inspired by her travels, life experiences, and the people she meets. She often draws from mythology, helping young readers' access values and principles in an easy and engaging way.

Sudha Murty grew up with her maternal grandparents listening to stories from their life and mythology. She believes this gave her a rich perspective to life. Unfortunately most children today don't grow up with their grandparents. Her writing aims to bridge this gap. She brings life lessons alive through simple stories which are relevant and catch their attention. Gratitude, hard work, compassion and empathy are recurring themes communicated in her simple and heartwarming style. Her stories have a fable-like quality attracting people across all ages.

Her books have also been adapted into TV series and movies. Dollar Bahu, originally written in Kannada, was adapted into a TV series by Zee TV in 2001. Runa, a novel in Kannada, was adapted into a Marathi film in 2003. Her book - 'The Bird with the Golden Wings' has been adapted into a Netflix series. In addition, 52 stories from her books have come to life in an animation show called Story Time with Sudha Amma, available on Murty Media's YouTube channel.

Sudha Murty's literary work has been recognized through multiple awards including the Sahitya Academy Award in 2023, the R.K. Narayan Award for Literature in 2006, and the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Award in 2020 among others. She holds ten honorary doctorates in literature from universities across India.
